Describe the nominee's commitment to volunteering with the agency/organization they serve. (300 words maximum)

Opened in January 2019, the HOPE Center links HSK clients with jobs and, if needed, provides transportation to and from work for these people. Although the concept of HOPE is fairly simple, the execution is not! We provide HSK clients with access to resources and employment opportunities by partnering with a variety of employers, municipalities, and other local agencies.

Reese and her grandmother have been coming to The HOPE Center every other Tuesday starting in the fall of 2023 except for holiday and school breaks. They originally volunteered in the Hickory Soup Kitchen grocery, but soon found out that there were enough volunteers in the grocery and wanted to volunteer where they were most needed. They contacted me to see if it was possible to volunteer at The HOPE Center. Because we are so small we normally don't need a lot of volunteer assistance. Once I understood why they wanted to volunteer and what they wanted to do then I agreed.

Through the use of our HOPE Van we provide transportation to and from work for up to six clients at a time depending on the route and time of day. Part of our HOPE program includes a bag lunch. These are given out Monday, Wednesday, and Friday to our riders. These bag lunches include enough food for two lunches, two breakfasts, and plenty of snacks. We always make sure they include a microwavable type protein/entrée like mac and cheese or ramen noodles. Reese and her grandmother have taken over the preparation of the lunch bags to much success.

Describe nominee's accomplishments and how their service has helped meet critical needs in our community. (300 words maximum)

I am so thankful for the work that Reese and her grandmother have to help The HOPE Center in preparing lunch bags for our working clients who ride the HOPE Van to work during the week. The first obstacle our clients face is getting a job that will not just provide them with income, but one that will also have a support system that will enable them to achieve simple goals. Without this support system they are less likely to be successful. For The HOPE Center providing not just transportation, but also a lunch gives our clients some food to keep them from going hungry on a daily basis. Having breakfast and lunch while working a labor intensive job is of vital importance. This is a critical part of our program that we are constantly trying to improve. Our objective is to help move HOPE Center clients from dependence on HSK and other agencies to independence. We do this by providing the opportunity for these people, most who are socially and economically disadvantaged, to get a decent job and thus begin to bring in income and to get on a path to self-sufficiency.

Through the efforts of Reese and her grandmother our clients have some support towards self sufficiency.

Describe nominee's special skills, qualities and/or leadership qualities. (300 words maximum)

Reese is one of the most enthusiastic, giving young people I have ever met. She has a big heart and an empathic personality. She not only sees the bigger picture, but also wants to do all within her ability to help those in need. Even though she is only a middle schooler I have found her to be an old soul trying to find where she fits in and how she will make a mark on this world.

Explain why you nominated this person(s) for the Giving From the Heart Award. (300 words maximum)

I have known Reese's family for many years, but I didn't personally meet her until the fall of 2023. Reese really struggled socially during the 2022-2023 school year. Part of this struggle to fit in and find her place occurred from being the target of bullying by other students. Whether this was because she is a unique individual or because of her attention deficit disorder I do not know. When the 2023-2024 school year started out with the repeated bullying her parents made the decision to pull her out of school to be home - schooled during the week by her grandparents. She lives over an hour from home during the week. This has been challenging for her, her parents, and her grandparents, but the phrase it takes a village is quite fitting in this situation. Part of her curriculum has included community service or volunteering in the community. This has been successful due to her learning style and the structure of being educated at home. Reese has embraced the situation and has thrived this past year. I nominated Reese for a United Way Giving from the Heart award because despite the difficulties she has faced socially and academically she has persevered and wants to play a part in making a difference in the world. I hope volunteering at The HOPE Center has been as impactful on her as it has been on us.
